

Hematite Convertible Choker

Materials:

10464241	28"	Bead Gallery® 5mm hematite rondelles
10472582	14"	Bead Gallery® 6mm silver rhinestone rounds
10508458	1	Bead Gallery® 10mm silver rhinestone round
	48"	Beadalon .015" 49-strand flexible beading wire
	6	Beadalon #2 gunmetal crimp tubes
	2	7mm jump rings
	1	lobster clasp
	1	silver ball pin

Tools:

wire nippers
chain-nose pliers (2)
round-nose pliers
crimping pliers

Tip: Measure your neck at the point where you want the choker to hit. String the necklace so that it is that length. If you want adjustability, add a 1" chain to the end of the necklace. Attach the rhinestone ball to the end of the chain and attach the other end of the chain to the jump ring. This would work especially well if you plan to use the choker as a wrap bracelet as well.

Time to create: 1 hour

Instructions:

1. Slide 1 10mm rhinestone round onto a ball pin. Make a wrapped loop. Slide this drop onto a jump ring and close the jump ring.
2. Cut 3 16" lengths of flexible beading wire.
3. Attach a piece of beading wire to the jump ring in step 1 using a crimp tube. Repeat two more times so all three pieces of beading wire are connected to the jump ring.
4. String 14" of hematite disks and 1 crimp tube. Pass the wire through the second jump ring and back through the crimp tube. Crimp the tube and trim excess wire.
5. Repeat step 4 using the second wire and 6mm rhinestone rounds.
6. Repeat step 4 exactly on using the third wire and hematite disks.
7. Open second jump ring and attach lobster clasp.
8. Wear around your neck or doubled as a wrap bracelet.
